

## **INTRODUCTION**

The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs was established in April, 2012. Subsequently, the Prime Minister's Public Affairs and Grievances Wing was transferred to the Ministry by the Prime Minister's Office in June, 2013.



The Ministry primarily deals with business of the Government in Parliament and supervises the entire legislative process, including the summoning and prorogation of sessions of both Houses of Parliament, follow-up on Government assurances given in Parliament, and legislation pertaining to the functions. It plays an important role in coordinating and maintaining liaison between the legislature and the executive, with the objective of ensuring harmonious functioning. Moreover, the Prime Minister's Public Affairs and Grievances Wing of the Ministry is tasked with the redressal of complaints received from citizens across Pakistan, and also overseas Pakistanis.



## **FUNCTIONS OF THE MINISTRY OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS**

Following functions have been allocated to the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs under Rules of Business, 1973:

1. Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament), summoning of either House or both Houses or Joint Sitting of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) and prorogation thereof.
2. Dissolution of the National Assembly.
3. Liaison between the Divisions and Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) in respect of official and non-official business; priority of official business.
4. Follow up of the assurances, promises and undertakings given by the Federal Government on the floor of the House with a view to their implementation by the Divisions concerned.
5. Submission of Bills passed by Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) or by the National Assembly to the President for his assent.
6. Legislation pertaining to privileges of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) and members of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament), salaries and allowances of the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Senate, Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly and members of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament).
7. Legislation pertaining to the Leader of the House and the Leader of the Opposition, provision of staff and other facilities for the Leader of the House.
8. Rules of Procedure of either House or Joint Sitting of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament).
9. Legislation pertaining to punishment of persons who refuse to give evidence or produce documents before Committees of National Assembly or the Senate.
10. Appointment and terms and conditions of Federal Parliamentary Secretaries.
11. Legislative business relating to the Election Commission.
12. Prime Minister's Public Affairs / Grievances Wing.
13. Administrative functions in respect of the following laws, namely:-
  - (a) Members of Parliament (Salaries and Allowances) Act, 1974 (XXVII of 1974):
  - (b) Chairman and Speaker (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) Act, 1975 (LXXXII of 1975);
  - (c) Deputy Chairman and Deputy Speaker (Salaries, Allowances and Privileges) Act, 1975 (LXXXIII of 1975):
  - (d) Members of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) Immunities and Privileges Act, 2023 (XX of 2023)

## **ADMINISTRATIVE SETUP OF THE MINISTRY**

Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs comprises of three wings namely:

1. Administration Wing
2. Legislation Wing
3. Prime Minister's Public Affairs and Grievances Wing (PM's PA&GW)

### **1. Administration Wing:**

The Wing is headed by a Joint Secretary who is assisted by a Deputy Secretary, four Section Officers, an Accounts Officer and a Programmer. It is responsible for Personnel Administration, Human Resource Management, General Administration, Coordination & Litigation and Budgetary Matters etc. as follows: -

- All matters of coordination of M/o Parliamentary Affairs with all Constitutional Bodies, Ministries / Divisions, attached Departments, Sub-Ordinate Offices and Autonomous Bodies / corporations.
- All matters relating to local/foreign trainings, workshops and seminars, Prime Minister's Delivery Unit, Prime Minister's Citizen Portal, matters relating to Cabinet Decisions.
- Human Resource Management of Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs including recruitment, placement of officers/staff, their promotions, discipline and retirement, grant of long leave, etc.
- Appearance in the Courts in court cases wherein M/o Parliamentary Affairs is the Respondent/Party.
- All matters relating to smooth operation of transport fleet of the Ministry and procurement of stationery, store items, office furniture and miscellaneous items and repair/maintenance of vehicles, furniture and other machinery and office equipment.

## **2. Legislation Wing:**

The Wing is headed by a Joint Secretary who is assisted by three Deputy Secretaries, two Assistant Secretaries and two Section Officers, mainly responsible to liaise between Government and the Parliament for legislative business and other functions including:

- Summoning and prorogation of National Assembly, Senate and Joint Sittings.
- Submission of Bills passed by Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) or by the National Assembly to the President for his assent.
- Liaison between the Divisions and Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) in respect of official and non-official business; priority of official business.
- All matters relating to three Committees of the Parliament (National Assembly & Senate) that are directly dealt within the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs i.e. Committee on Government Assurances, Standing Committee on Rules of Procedure and Privileges and Standing Committee on Parliamentary Affairs.
- Appointment and terms and conditions of Federal Parliamentary Secretaries.
- Legislative business relating to the Election Commission.

## **3. Public Affairs and Grievances Wing:**

This Wing is headed by a Joint Secretary, who is assisted by three Deputy Secretaries and six Section Officers to ensure expedited and timely processing of public complaints. It plays a pivotal role in addressing grievances received from individuals across Pakistan, including those from overseas Pakistanis, facilitating their resolution in a timely manner.

#### **1.4 Budget & Accounts Section**

- a) The primary objective of the Budget & Accounts Section of the Ministry is to maintain a high level of financial discipline while continually improving the quality of financial operations within the Ministry. This includes attending meetings of the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) and conducting Departmental Accounts Committee meetings to discuss Audit Paras and Appropriation Accounts with the National Assembly Secretariat, the Office of the Director General (Federal Audit) in Islamabad, and the Office of the AGPR in Islamabad.
- b) Another achievement of the Budget & Accounts Section during the financial year 2024-2025, in relation to financial discipline, was the timely, accurate, and prompt reconciliation of the Ministry's monthly expenditures with AGPR figures. This reconciliation was in compliance with the critical requirements set forth by the Controller General of Accounts (CGA). The provisions contained in the Financial Management Act, 2019, and the FM & PAO Powers Regulation, 2021, issued by the Finance Division, are adhered to in both letter and spirit.
- c) The Budget & Accounts Section issued Surrender Orders and processed cases related to the appropriation of funds in a timely manner, following instructions issued by the Finance Division. Additionally, the preparation of information called for in the Budget Call Circular 2025-26 was completed and submitted to the Finance Division well in advance.

## 2. LEGISLATION WING


### 2.1 NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BRANCH

#### 2.1.1 Sessions of National Assembly

In terms of Article 54 (1) of the Constitution, the President summon either House or both Houses or Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) in joint sitting to meet at such time and place as he thinks fit and also prorogue the same.

Article 54 (2) of the Constitution provides that the National Assembly shall meet for not less than **130 working days** in each parliamentary year.

During the financial year (from 01-07-2024 to 30-06-2025) the National Assembly convened **thirteen (13) sessions**, including **two (2) Joint Sittings**, accumulating to a **total one hundred forty-two working (142) days** (Annex-II).



## 2.2. ANNUAL CALENDAR FOR SESSIONS

In pursuance of the above provisions, the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs regularly calls sessions of the two Houses for which annual calendar for Sessions is approved in advance. Rule-46(1&2) of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007 provides that:-

- (1) “after the commencement of each parliamentary year, the M/o Parliamentary Affairs shall provide a calendar for sessions of the Assembly to the Speaker.
- (2) The Secretary shall cause the calendar to be circulated amongst the members.”


The Annual Calendar is prepared to forecast the likely engagements of the Parliamentarians in order to enable them to plan their personal/professional program accordingly. This practice is also intended to help the Cabinet members to pre-plan their schedule of activities.

## 2.3. ORDERS OF THE DAY

Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs issued **eighty (80)** Orders of the Day to transact Government business viz: official Bills, Reports to be laid, Motions etc. in the National Assembly under rule 52 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007.

### 2.4 JOINT SITTING

On 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2025, the President of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan addressed the Parliament (Joint Sitting) to meet the constitutional requirement under Article 56 (3) of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan.

### 2.5 PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARIES

All the matters relating to Parliamentary Secretaries viz; their appointments, terms & conditions and salaries/allowances, etc. are managed by this Wing. Details may be seen on the Ministry's website.

### 2.6 SENATE BRANCH

The President, under Clause (1) of Article 54 of the Constitution of Islamic Republic Pakistan, is empowered to summon either House or both Houses of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) in joint sitting to meet at such time and place as he thinks fit and also to prorogue the same.


Article 61 read with Article 54 (2) of the Constitution provides that Senate shall meet for not less than one hundred and ten (110) working days during each Parliamentary Year.

The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, took into consideration the requisite number keeping in view the requirements of mandatory working days and the availability of Government business provided by Ministries, Divisions, and Departments, prepared and obtained approval for a tentative schedule of sessions of Senate from the Federal Cabinet for the period from 12th March 2024 to

11th March 2025. The summaries for summoning of Senate sessions were initiated strictly in accordance with the approved schedule during the Parliamentary year. However, certain deviations were made depending on the exigencies of administrative factors.

## 2.7 SESSIONS OF THE SENATE

During the aforementioned period, Senate convened **twelve (12) sessions**, accumulating to **a total of one hundred and seventeen (117) working days** (Annex-VIII).




## 2.8 ORDERS OF THE DAY





#### **3.1 Prime Minister’s Public Affairs and Grievances Wing**



These grievances mainly pertain to land revenue, law and order, human rights and basic services, etc. During the financial year 2024-25, 17671 petitions/ complaints were received, out of which 16767 were disposed of, while 904 petitions/ complaints are under process in various Government Ministries/ Departments/ Agencies at Federal and provincial level.





### 3.4 New Initiatives

The Website of this Ministry (<https://mopa.gov.pk>), webpage (<https://web.citizenportal.gov.pk>), Official WhatsApp Number (0315-8334456) and Official Email ID ([contact.pagw@mopa.gov.pk](mailto:contact.pagw@mopa.gov.pk)) were already established and operationalized for the information of general public and submission of their grievances within the country and from abroad as well, during the financial year 2023-2024.

The Prime Minister's Public Affairs & Grievances Wing of the M/o Parliamentary Affairs has recently undertaken a series of new initiatives in line with the approved Public Awareness Management System. These initiatives are in furtherance of the government commitment to ensure effective grievances redressal for the public. The following new initiatives have been taken during FY 2024-2025.

A Universal Access Number (051-111-555-554) for lodging complaints is now fully operational with dedicated staff at the premises of Prime Minister's Public Affairs & Grievances Wing to facilitate public access to grievance redressal service.

The Ministry of Defence has been approached to display an awareness Campaign messages on Digital electronic screens placed at the airports.

The Secretary General National Assembly has been approached for display of awareness Campaign messages on Digital electronic screens and placement of standees at the National Assembly premises.

Pakistan Post has been approached to establish dedicated complaint boxes at prominent places to facilitate the submission of written grievances.

Displayed adhesive banners on two out of four Khyber Mail trains. Further, the Secretary, Ministry of Railways has been approached again for display of adhesive banners on all Khyber Mail Train & Passenger Train.

The SMS sensitizing the general public to lodge their complaints, if any, with the Prime Minister's Public Affairs & Grievances Wing were sent through PTA to 180 million mobile users of various networks.

E-Banners and physical standees were placed at key public location, including railway stations, airports and the parliament building to ensure maximum visibility and public awareness.

### **IMPACT**

A total of 9501 complaints were received during the financial year 2023-24, while 17671 complaints/applications have been received during the financial year 2024-25. It shows that 53% more complaints were processed/disposed of as compared to the previous year. There was 47% increase for Punjab Province, 52% increase for KP/ICT/GB/AJK/OP and 74% increase in total complaints/applications for the province of Sindh/Balochistan.

Since the launch of awareness campaign, approximately 23% complaints were received through official WhatsApp number.

### **PROPOSED FUTURE INITIATIVES**

In order to avoid duplication of the complaints and also on the direction of the Standing Committee on Parliamentary Affairs, the process of integration of public grievances system of provinces with the Pakistan Citizen Portal (PCP) is under process.

To enhance public engagement through the Pakistan Television and other private channels.

A structured media presence particularly targeting remote areas, to enhance public engagement through quarterly newsletters and newspaper publications.
