A. INTRODUCTION

Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs was established in April, 2012. Subsequently, the Prime Minister's Public Affairs and Grievances Wing was also transferred to this Ministry by Prime Minister's Office in June, 2013.



The Ministry primarily deals with the business of the Government in Parliament and supervises the entire legislative process such as summoning and prorogation of both the houses of the Parliament; follow up of Government Assurances given in the Parliament, legislation pertaining to functions of both the Houses. It plays an important role in coordinating and maintaining liaison amongst different organs of the State with the objective of ensuring harmonious functions of the polity. Moreover, Prime Minister's Public Affairs and Grievances Wing (PA&GW) of the Ministry is also redressing grievances of the common people.

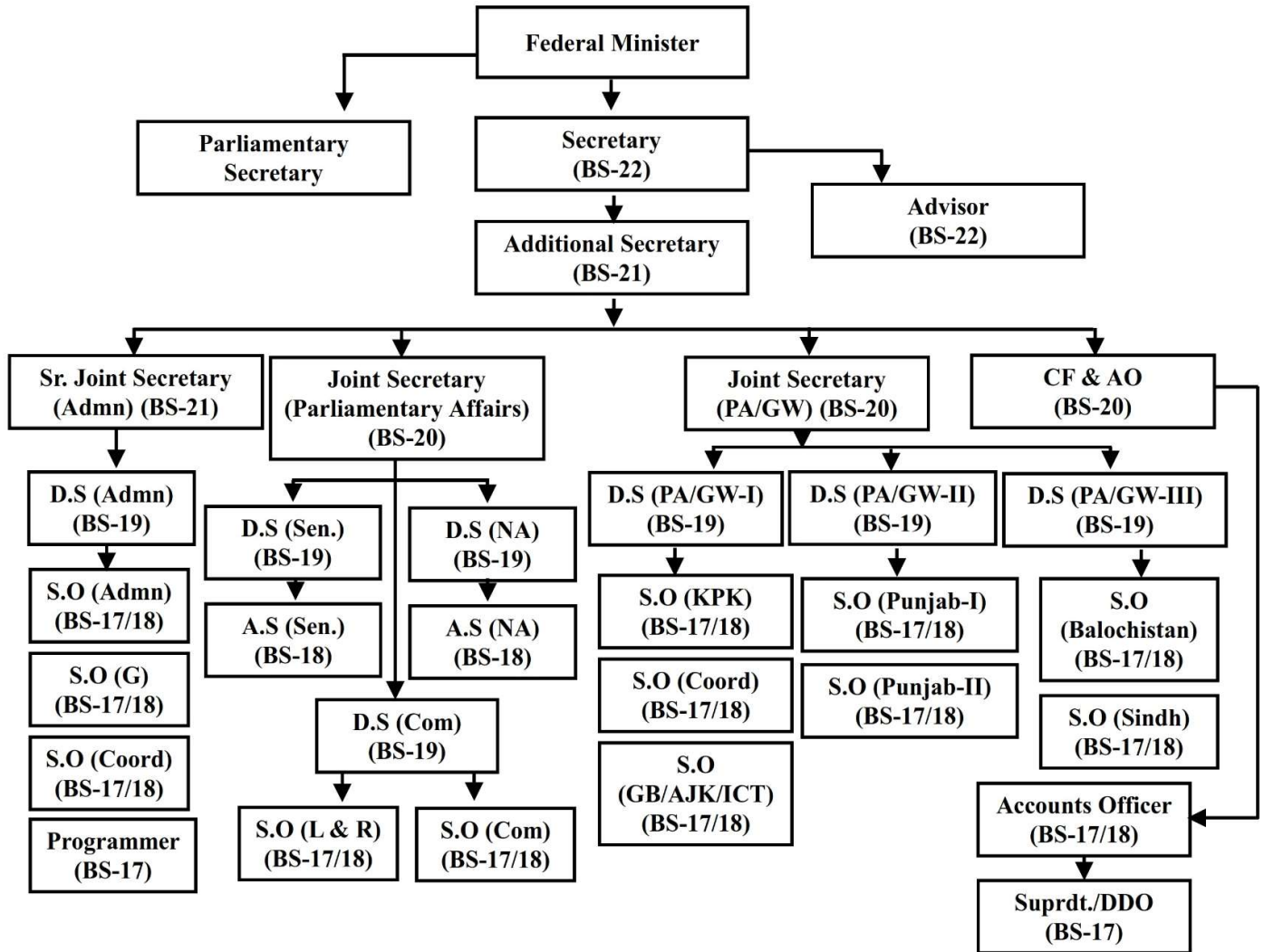

B. FUNCTIONS OF THE MINISTRY OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS

The Following functions have been allocated to the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs under Rules of Business, 1973:

1. Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament), summoning of either House or both Houses or Joint Sitting of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) and prorogation thereof.
2. Dissolution of the National Assembly.
3. Liaison between the Divisions and Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) in respect of official and non-official business; priority of official business.
4. Follow up of the assurances, promises and undertakings given by the Federal Government on the floor of the House with a view to their implementation by the Divisions concerned.
5. Submission of Bills passed by Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) or by the National Assembly to President for his assent.
6. Legislation pertaining to privileges of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) and members of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament), salaries and allowances of the Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Senate, Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly and members of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament).
7. Legislation pertaining to the Leader of the House and the Leader of the Opposition, provision of staff and other facilities for the Leader of the House.
8. Rules of Procedure of either House or Joint Sitting of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament).
9. Legislation pertaining to punishment of persons who refuse to give evidence or produce documents before committees of National Assembly or the Senate.
10. Appointment and terms and conditions of Federal Parliamentary Secretaries.
11. Legislative business relating to the Election Commission.
12. Prime Minister Public Affairs and Grievances Wing.

C. **ADMINISTRATIVE SETUP OF THE MINISTRY.**

Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs comprises of three wings namely:

1. Parliamentary Affairs Wing
2. Administration Wing.
3. Prime Minister's Public Affairs and Grievances Wing (PM's PA&GW).

1. **Parliamentary Affairs Wing:**

The Parliamentary Affairs Wing is headed by a Joint Secretary who is assisted by three Deputy Secretaries, two Assistant Secretaries and two Section Officers. It is mainly responsible to liaise between the Divisions and the Parliament for legislative business.

2. **Administration Wing:**

The Administration Wing is headed by a Senior Joint Secretary who is assisted by Deputy Secretary, three Section Officers, an Accounts Officer and a Programmer. It is responsible for personnel administration, human resource management and budgetary matters, etc.

3. **Public Affairs and Grievances Wing:**

This Wing is headed by a Joint Secretary, who is assisted by three Deputy Secretaries and seven Section Officers. The Wing facilitates in resolving the public grievances with people friendly approach.

PARLIAMENATRY AFFAIRS WING

1. NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BRANCH

1.1 Sessions of National Assembly

In terms of Article 54 (1) of the Constitution, the President summons either House or both Houses or Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) in joint sitting to meet at such time and place as he thinks fit and also prorogues the same.

Article 54 (2) of the Constitution provides that the National Assembly shall meet for not less than 130 working days in each parliamentary year.

During the financial year (from 01.07.2022 to 30.06.2023) the National Assembly convened Eleven (11) sessions, including Three (3) Joint Sitings, accumulating to a total one hundred and fifty-six working (156) days.

1.2. Annual Calendar for Sessions

In pursuance of the above provisions, the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs regularly calls sessions of the two Houses for which annual calendar for Sessions is approved in advance. Rule-46(1&2) of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007 provides that: -

- i. “after the commencement of each parliamentary year, the M/o. Parliamentary Affairs shall provide a calendar for sessions of the Assembly to the Speaker.

- (2) The Secretary shall cause the calendar to be circulated amongst the members.”

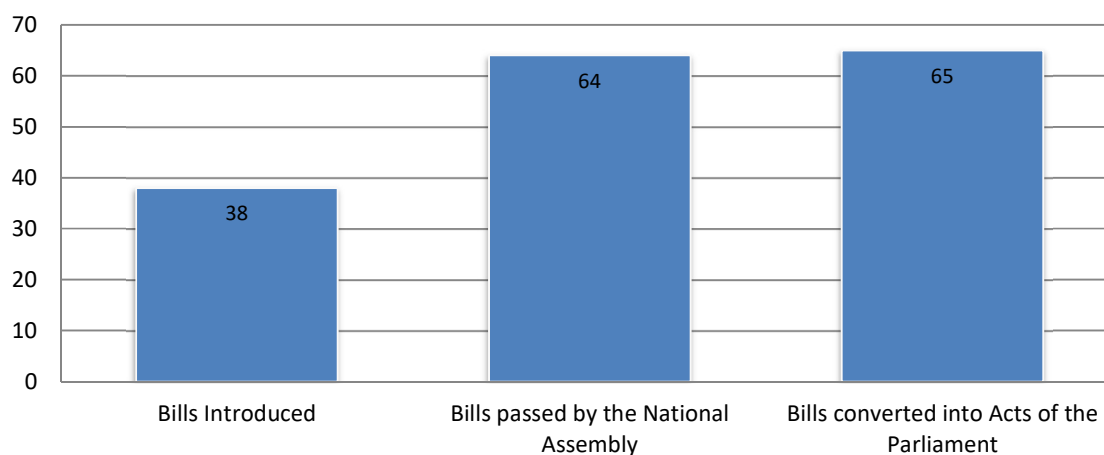
The Annual Calendar is prepared to forecast the likely engagements of the Parliamentarians in order to enable them to plan their personal/professional program accordingly. This practice is also intended to help the Cabinet members to pre-plan their schedule of activities.

1.3. Orders of the Day

Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs issued eighty-five (85) Orders of the Day to transact Government business viz: official Bills, Reports to be laid, Motions etc. in the National Assembly under rule 38 of Rules of Business, 1973 and Rule 52 of the rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007.

1.6. Amendments in the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007.

In pursuance of Cabinet decision in cases No. 241/15/2018 dated 12-04-2018 and No. 64/05/2022 dated 15-2-2022 the following amendments in Rules of National Assembly were made in the sittings of National Assembly and notified vide S.R.O 180(I)/2023 dated 03-02-2023:-

(1) Amendment in Rule 46 of the Rules of Procedure.- That in the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly,2007, hereinafter referred to as the said Rules, in Rule 46, in sub-rule (1), for the word “Government”, the words “Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs” have been substituted.

(2) Amendment in Rule 227 of the Rules of Procedure.- That in the said Rules, in rule 227, in sub-rule (1), in the second proviso, for the word “Government”, the words “Ministry concerned”, have been substituted.

(3) Amendment in Rule 233 of the Rules of Procedure.- That in the said Rules, in Rule 233, in sub-rule (4), for the word “Government” the words “Ministry concerned”, have been substituted.

The following amendments were also adopted by the National Assembly and notified vide S.R.Os. No. 12(I)/2023, dated 9-5-2023 and No. 686 dated 30-05-2023:-

a. **244(D) (1) Committee of the Whole House.** The House may, on a motion moved by any member of the House, resolve and constitute itself into a Committee of the Whole House consisting of all of its members and shall function as one Committee acting upon any legislation, resolution or a matter referred to it by the House.

(2) The proceedings of the Committee shall be according to the rules of the House but a member may speak more than once.

(3) The Committee shall be presided over by a Chairperson who may be any member nominated by the Speaker and the Speaker’s Chair shall remain vacant and the Chairperson shall occupy the Tables with designated officials sitting on either side.

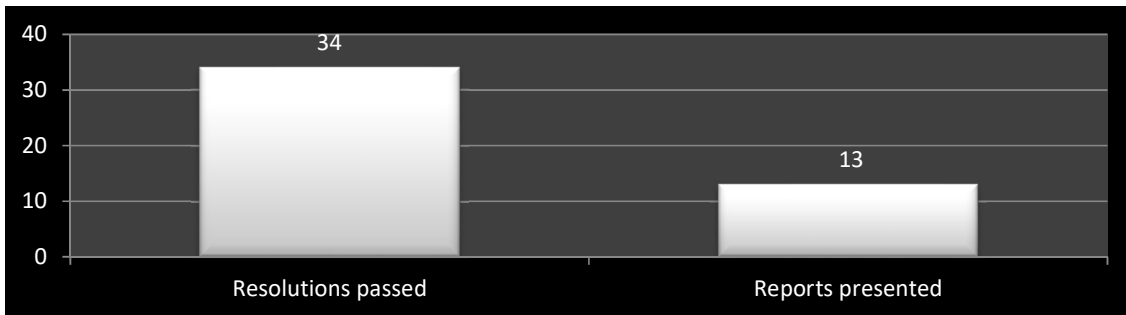
(4) The quorum of the Committee shall be one-fifth of the total membership of the House.

(5) The Committee shall present its report to the House on completion of the deliberation and the same procedure shall be followed as provided for in these rules for report of the Standing Committee.

b. **Amendment in rule 49 of the Rules of Procedure.**- That in the said Rules, in Rule 49, after sub-rule (2) (a) the new clause “(aa) suspend the proceedings of the Assembly on Azan for each prayer; and” has been inserted.

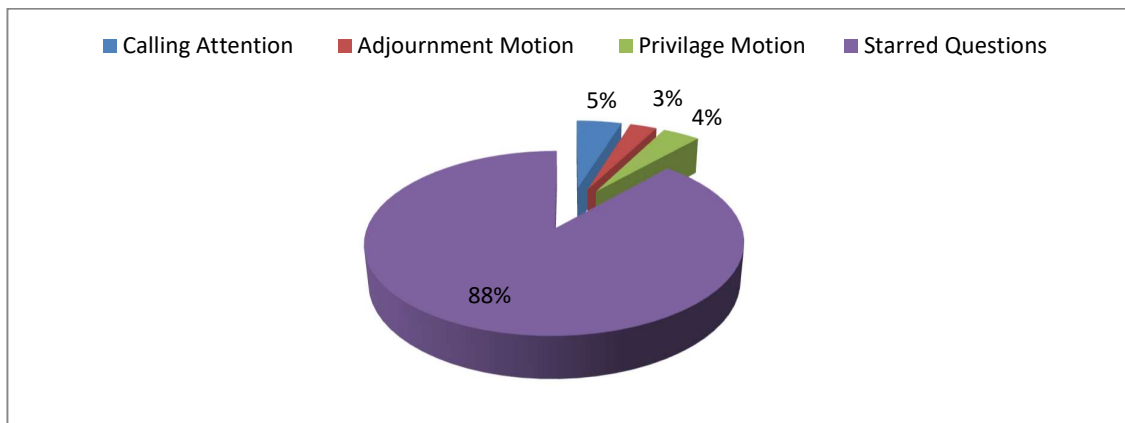

1.9. Joint Sitting (Address of President)

On 6th October 2022, the President of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan addressed the Parliament (Joint Sitting) to meet the constitutional requirement under Article 56 (3) of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan.

1.10 Parliamentary Secretaries

All the matters relating to Parliamentary Secretaries viz; their appointments, terms & conditions and salaries/allowances, etc. are managed by this Wing. Details may be seen on the Ministry's website.

2. SENATE BRANCH

The President, under Clause (1) of Article 54 of the Constitution of Islamic Republic Pakistan, is empowered to summon either House or both Houses of Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) in joint sitting to meet at such time and place as he thinks fit and also to prorogue the same.

Article 61, read with Article 54 (2) of the Constitution provides that Senate shall meet for not less than one hundred and ten (110) working days during each Parliamentary Year.

The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, takes into consideration the requisite number of mandatory working days and the availability of Government business provided by Ministries/Divisions and Departments, prepared and obtained approval for a tentative schedule of sessions of Senate from the Prime Minister for the period from 12th March 2022 to 11th March 2023. The summaries for summoning of Senate sessions were initiated in accordance with approved schedule during the Parliamentary Year. However, certain deviations were made depending upon the exigencies of administrative factors.

2.1 Sessions of the Senate

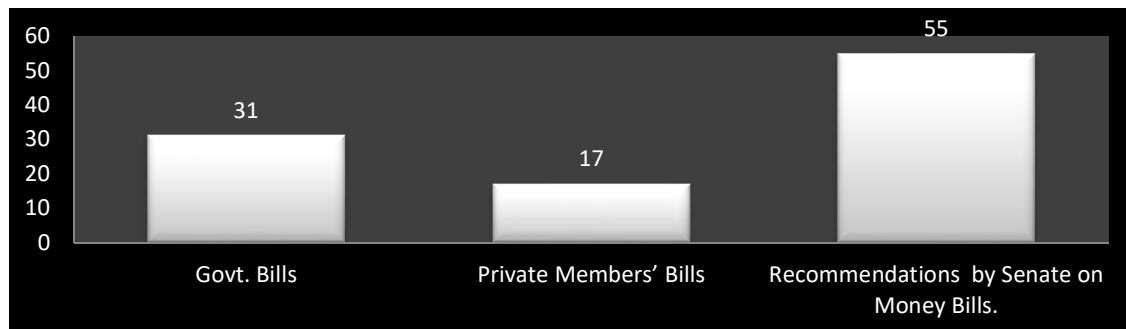
During the aforementioned period, the Senate convened Fourteen (14) sessions, including two (02) Joint Sittings, accumulating to a total of one hundred and eight (108) working days, (**Annex-VII**).

2.2 Orders of the Day

In compliance of rule 38 of the Rules of Business, 1973, the Ministry issued sixty-three (63) Orders of the Day in the year, 2022-2023, pertaining to introduction, consideration and passage of Government legislative business in the Senate. b. In compliance with Article 73 of the Constitution, the Finance Minister presented the Finance Bill, 2023, before the Senate for making recommendations thereon. The Senate extensively deliberated on the Bill and made Fifty-five (55) recommendations for consideration of the National Assembly. Furthermore, the Senate also submitted its recommendations to the National Assembly on the Bill titled “The Tax Laws (Second Amendment) Ordinance, 2022” (No. VI of 2022)

2.3 Calling Attention Notices, Adjournment Motions, Privilege Motion and Questions

During the year 2022-2023, the Senate received a total of ninety-eight (98) Calling Attention Notices, eleven (11) Adjournment Motions, eight (8) Privilege Motions whereas three hundred and forty-four (344) starred and un-starred questions were replied. (**Annex-XI**).

Legislation & Research Section is responsible to conduct analysis of Legislations/Bills including Private Members’ Bills and legal cases pertaining to Election Commission of Pakistan wherein Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs is impleaded as respondent.

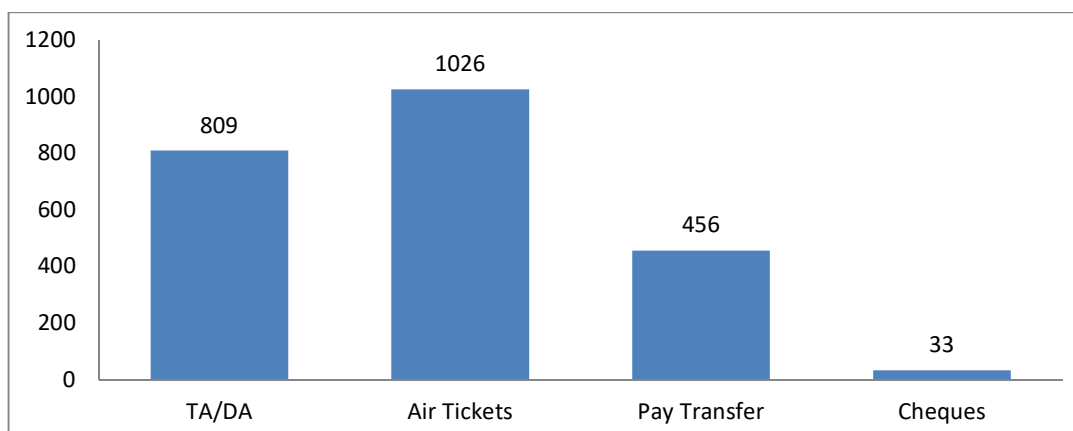
2.4 Budget & Accounts Section

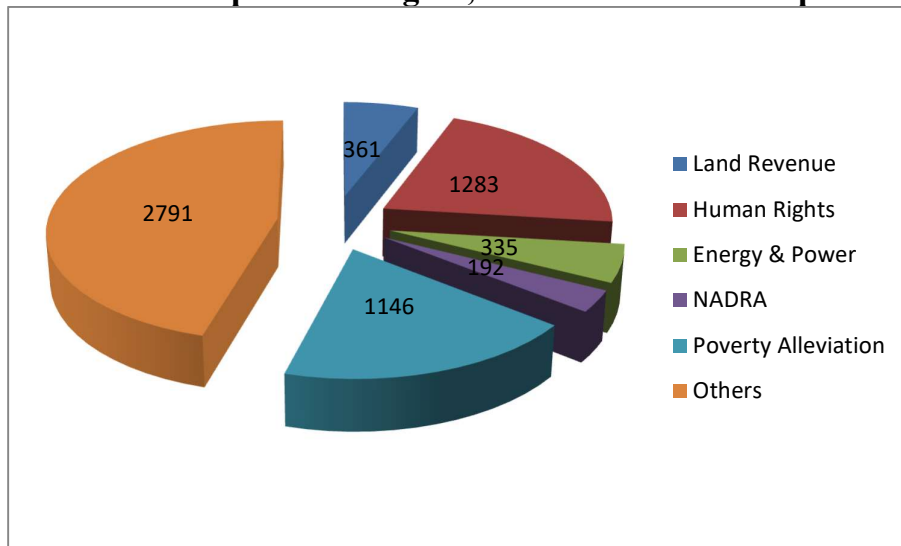

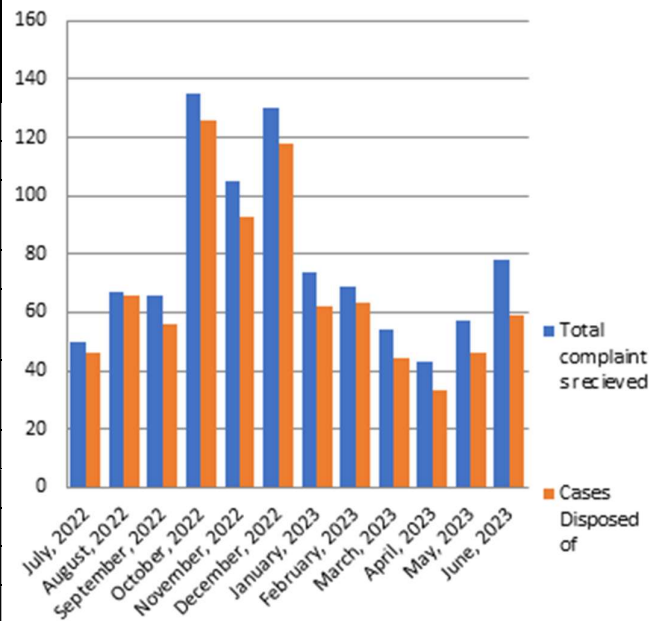

Share of each province/region, out of total 6356 complaints



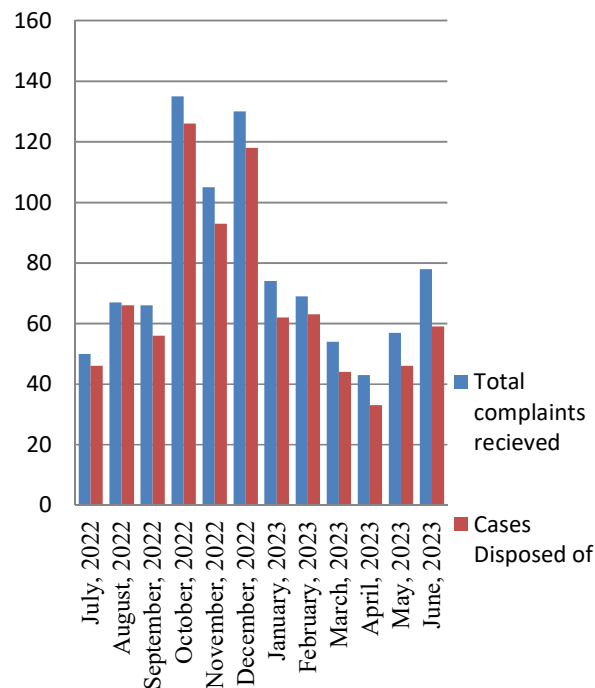
